CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Picerno called the meeting to order.

INVOCATION

2. ADDITIONAL AGENDA

Upon motion made by Chairman Picerno, seconded by Commissioner Von Canon, the Board voted 5-0 to add to the agenda under Appointments the appointment of the Clerk to the Board.

A. GIS/IT - Call To – Amendment to the Moore County Road Name and Addressing Ordinance

GIS Coordinator Rachel Smith requested the Board call a public hearing regarding an amendment to the Road Name and Addressing Ordinance. Due to the continuation of another hearing on November 19, 2024, Chairman Picerno recommended tabling the call-to item to November 19, 2024. **Upon motion made by Chairman Picerno, seconded by Commissioner Cook, the Board voted 5- to table this item to November 19, 2024.**

7. QUASI-JUDICIAL HEARINGS

A. Planning - Call To for a Quasi-Judicial Hearing for a Special Use Permit for a Conservation Subdivision –Brookwood Phase 5– PID 00991560

Upon motion made by Chairman Picerno, seconded by Commissioner Von Canon, the Board voted 5-0 to table this item to November 19, 2024.

8. OLD BUSINESS

There was no old business.

9. NEW BUSINESS

A. Human Resources - Wellness Works Contract

Dawn Gilbert, Assistant County Manager / Human Resources Director, requested the Board's approval of a contract for Wellness Works. **Upon motion made by Commissioner Quis, seconded by Commissioner Von Canon, the Board voted 5-0 to approve the Wellness Works contract with FirstHealth.**

B. Property Management - Property Exchange with Roseland Holdings, LLC

Gene Boles, Property Management Director, requested the Board's approval of a property swap to create a buffer between the Moore County Landfill and surrounding properties. **Upon motion made by Chairman Picerno, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the Board voted 5-0 to approve a resolution to transfer the property shown as Parcel 2 on the plat map from the County to Roseland Holdings, LLC and authorize the Chairman to execute the Warranty Deed in exchange for transfer of the property shown as Parcel 3 on the plat map from Roseland Holdings, LLC to the County.** The resolution and survey are hereby incorporated as a part of these minutes by attachment as Appendix H.

C. Administration - Moore County New Courthouse and Renovation - Change Order #9

Mr. Rich Smith requested the Board's approval of a change order for the

courthouse project. Upon motion made by Commissioner Von Canon, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the Board voted 5-0 to approve Change Order # 9 in the amount of \$117,548 between the County of Moore, NC and New Atlantic Contracting, Inc. of Winston-Salem, NC and request the Chairman to execute the same.

- D. Public Safety - Primary and Back-Up 911 Center TDMA/Zetron Upgrades
Bryan Phillips, Public Safety Director reviewed and requested the Board's approval of a contract for the TDMA/Zetron upgrades for the primary back-up and 911 center and approve the sole source document and budget amendment. Upon motion made by Commissioner Von Canon, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the Board voted 5-0 to approve a contract between the County of Moore and Radio Communication Company with a not to exceed cost of \$796,545.00 for the TDMA/Zetron upgrades at the primary and back-up 911 center and approve the sole source document and authorize the Chairman to sign all necessary documents upon finance and legal approval. Chairman Picerno made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Von Canon, to approve the budget amendment. Chairman Picerno asked for clarification regarding the budget amendment and Budget/Audit Director Tami Golden provided explanation. The motion to approve carried 5-0. The sole source and budget amendment are hereby incorporated as a part of these minutes by attachment as Appendix I.
- E. Public Safety - EMS VIPER TDMA Contract
Bryan Phillips, Public Safety Director requested the Board's approval of a contract for the EMS VIPER TDMA. Upon motion made by Chairman Picerno, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the Board voted 5-0 to approve the contract between the County of Moore and Radio Communication Company utilizing State Contract 725G for the purchase of TDMA Kenwood mobiles, portables, and Remote Desktop control stations for EMS not to exceed cost of \$147,372.60 and authorize the Chairman to sign all necessary documents upon finance and legal approval.
- F. Public Safety - Fire Department TDMA VIPER Purchase Contract
Bryan Phillips, Public Safety Director requested the Board's approval of a contract for the fire departments VIPER TDMA. Chairman Picerno made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, to approve the contract between the County of Moore and Radio Communication Company utilizing State Contract 725G for the purchase of TDMA Kenwood mobiles, portables, and Remote Desktop control stations for Fire Departments not to exceed cost of \$910,559.35 and authorize the Chairman to sign all necessary documents upon finance and legal approval. Chairman Picerno and County Manager Wayne Vest discussed that the American Rescue Plan funds were being used. The motion to approve carried 5-0.
- G. Legal - Resolution Adopting Transylvania County, NC to Offer Support and Services Needed for Recovery from Hurricane Helene
Chairman Picerno recommended the approval of a resolution adopting Transylvania County, NC for support in recovery from Hurricane Helene. Upon motion made by Chairman Picerno, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the

Board voted 5-0 to approve the resolution adopting Transylvania County, NC for the purpose of offering support and services, and prayers needed for recovery from Hurricane Helene. The resolution is hereby incorporated as a part of these minutes by attachment as Appendix J.

H. Legal - Resolution Requesting NCDOT to Place a Stoplight at the Intersection of NC HWY 5 and Turning Leaf Way

Upon motion made by Commissioner Quis, seconded by Commissioner Von Canon, the Board voted 5-0 to approve a resolution requesting the NC Department of Transportation to install a stoplight at the intersection of NC Highway 5 and Turning Leaf Way to better direct traffic and increase safety at that intersection. The resolution is hereby incorporated as a part of these minutes by attachment as Appendix K.

10. APPOINTMENTS

A. Board of Commissioners - Appointments to Aging Advisory Council

Upon motion made by Commissioner Von Canon, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the Board voted 5-0 to reappoint Brenda Ludeke, Bill Hughes, and Kim Hanson to the Aging Advisory Council for three-year terms expiring November 30, 2027.

B. Board of Commissioners - Appointment to the Sandhills Regional Library System Board of Trustees

Upon motion made by Commissioner Ritter, seconded by Commissioner Cook, the Board voted 5-0 to appoint Susan Zucchini to the Sandhills Regional Library System Board of Trustees to fill an unexpired term through June 30, 2028.

C. ADDITIONAL ITEM - Board of Commissioners – Appointment of Clerk to the Board of Commissioners

Upon motion made by Chairman Picerno, seconded by Commissioner Von Canon, the Board voted 5-0 to appoint Jennifer Parks as Clerk to the Board of Commissioners effective December 2, 2024, and approve her Personnel Action Request and authorize the Chairman to sign the form.

11. ADDITIONAL AGENDA

There were no additional agenda items.

12. MANAGER'S REPORT

County Manager Wayne Vest noted that Ms. Williams had done an outstanding job recently serving as both Clerk and Assistant County Manager. He reminded the commissioners of a Solid Waste Task Force meeting scheduled for the following day along with a ribbon-cutting for the new Aberdeen collection site. Mr. Vest commended Elections staff for their administration of the recent election.

13. COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS

The commissioners expressed thanks to Ms. Williams for her service as Clerk to the Board, and to the Elections staff for their work on the recent election, and offered

congratulations to Commissioner Picerno on his reelection and to commissioner-elect Tom Adams.

Mr. Vest followed up to also thank Property Management staff for their work for the election.

14. CLOSED SESSION

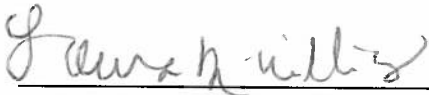

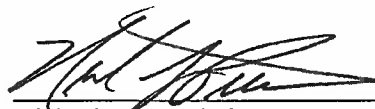
RESOLUTION FOR THE ABANDONMENT OF STREETS OR ROADS FROM THE

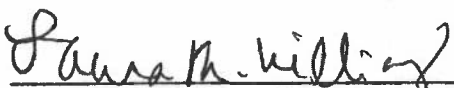
WHEREAS, January 11, 2025, is National Human Trafficking Awareness Day and everyone is encouraged to wear blue on this day to increase awareness of this issue.

WHEREAS, the County has given the required public notice, and the Board is convened in a regular meeting.

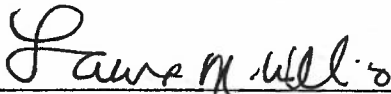

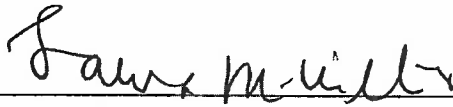

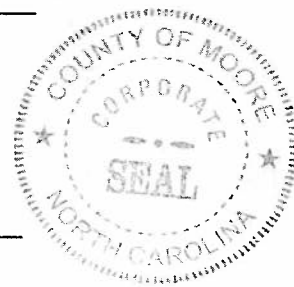

RESOLUTION BY THE MOORE COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY
COMMISSIONERS ADOPTING TRANSYLVANIA COUNTY,
NORTH CAROLINA TO OFFER SUPPORT AND SERVICES NEEDED FOR
RECOVERY FROM HURRICANE HELENE

WHEREAS, Transylvania County continues to be under a State of Emergency due to the catastrophic damage caused by Hurricane Helene that ripped through western North Carolina on September 27, 2024. Transylvania County was classified under the highest threat level under the National Weather Service for flooding, high winds, landslides, and debris flows and clean up and recovery are underway and will continue for the months ahead; and

WHEREAS, the Moore County Board of County Commissioners desires to support the counties in western North Carolina impacted by Hurricane Helene and believes Moore County can be most effective in lending support by adopting one of the impacted counties.

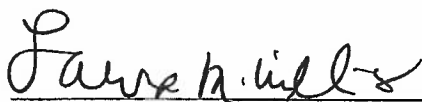
THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Moore County Board of County Commissioners hereby adopts Transylvania County for the purpose of offering support and services needed for recovery from Hurricane Helene.

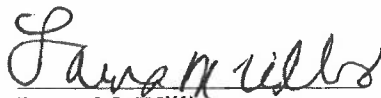
**RESOLUTION BY THE MOORE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
REQUESTING THE NORTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO
INSTALL A STOP LIGHT AT THE INTERSECTION OF TURNING LEAF WAY AND
NC HIGHWAY 5 LOCATED IN ABERDEEN, NC**

WHEREAS, a Moore County Solid Waste collection site and landfill are located at 456 Turning Leaf Way in Aberdeen, North Carolina which creates heavy traffic at the intersection of NC Highway 5 and Turning Leaf Way located in Aberdeen, North Carolina; and
